# Nick Duerksen Named Land Development Director for The Point

In addition, Nick worked to bring residential, office, retail, hospitality, cultural and entertainment venues to Sandy's downtown area known as The Cairns.

Nick started his career as a community development planner for <u>Five County Association of Governments</u> in southern Utah, which provided him with valuable insights into the importance of long-term, regional planning. "I find it very rewarding to take a project from the initial concept

phase and see it through to implementation," said Duerksen. "My previous work in transit-oriented development, economic development and regional planning have positioned me well for this role. I look forward to working with the public and our stakeholders to develop The Point into a live, work and play community that current and future generations of Utahns can enjoy."
